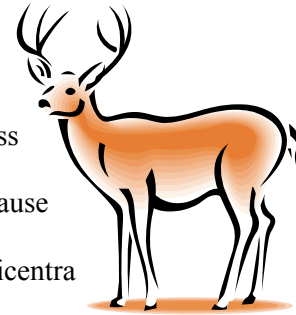


GOT DEER?
